CORRECTIVE QUITCLAIM DEED

KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS.

THAT, The State of New Hampshire, whose mailing address is P.O. Box 483, Concord, N.H. 03302-0483, by Charles P. O'Leary, Jr., Commissioner of The Department of Transportation, pursuant to vote of the Governor and Council on February 12, 1992, and in accordance with the provisions of New Hampshire Revised Statutes Annotated 228:31, for consideration paid, grant to the TOWN OF COLEBROOK, a municipal corporation in and of the County of Coos and State of New Hampshire, the following described real estate:

A certain parcel of property situated in the Town of Colebrook, County of Coos and State of New Hampshire, being described as follows: Commencing at the centerline of the railroad track on the southerly bound of Bridge Street in said Town of Colebrook;

Then easterly along the southerly bound of Bridge Street a distance of thirty-three (33) feet, this is the point of beginning of the herein described parcel of land;

Then South thirty-eight degrees nineteen minutes East (S 38 19' E) a distance of one hundred thirty-two (132) feet to the northwesterly corner of the Aileen Brigham property;

Then South forty-seven degrees West (S 47 W) along the westerly bound of the Brigham property a distance of three hundred thirty-two (332) feet, more or less;

Then South thirty-six degrees thirty minutes East (S 36 30' E) a distance of sixteen and five tenths (16.5) feet to a corner;

Then North seventy degrees East (N 70 E) a distance of one hundred thirteen (113) feet, more or less, to the southwest corner of the Pearl Gray property;

Then South twenty-nine degrees East (S 29 E) a distance of sixty-six (66) feet, more or less;

Then North eighty-four degrees East (N 84 E) a distance of one hundred sixty-two and five-tenths (162.5) feet, more or less, to the southwest corner of the Henry Gorman property;

Then South thirty-seven degrees thirty minutes East (S 37 30' E) a distance of one hundred seventy (170) feet, more or less, to the southeast corner of the Gorman property;

Then North fifty-two degrees thirty minutes East (N 52 30' E) a distance of one hundred (100) feet to the southerly bound of Bridge Street;

Then South thirty-eight degrees nineteen minutes East (S 38 19' E) a distance of one hundred eight (108) feet, more or less, to the northwest corner of the Louis Grandmaison property;

Then South thirty-six degrees West (S 36 W) a distance of six hundred twelve (612) feet, more or less, along the westerly bound of the Grandmaison property and the Andrew George property;

Then North sixty-two degrees thirty minutes West (N 62 30' W) a distance of three hundred fifty-one (351) feet, more or less, to a point;

Then South fifty-five degrees West (S 55 W) a distance of two hundred ninety-five (295) feet, more or less, to the easterly limits of the State of New Hampshire right-of-way;

Then North twenty-seven degrees thirty minutes East (N 27 30' E) along the right-of-way a distance of one thousand one hundred twenty-eight (1128) feet, more or less, to the point of beginning.

This transfer is subject to the following condition:

1. The existing side track must be retained to allow for future rail shipping industry. This side track may be relocated.

The sole purpose of this deed is to eliminate conditions #2 and 3 of the original quitclaim deed, which was recorded June 14, 1979, in Book 620, Page 108.

- The existing side track must be retained to allow for future rail shipping industry. This side track may be relocated.
- The New Hampshire Transportation Authority and the New Hampshire Department of Public Works and Highways retain the right to extract gravel for maintenance purposes from this parcel until such time as the gravel deposit area is required for industrial construction. At no time will any gravel be removed that impinges the lateral support of any adjoining property. Also reserved is the right to pass over said parcel to extract and transport the gravel.
- The town shall make every reasonable effort to secure rail using industry for this site.

Authorization for this transfer was granted by the Governor of New Hampshire and the Executive Council on December 6, 1978

Consideration for this transfer is \$2,450.00.
