Any and all interest the State of New Hampshire has in lar building located between the former Maine Central Railroad tracks (r of New Hampshire) and land now or formerly of the George L. O'Neil & Legion, Post No. 62 (which land is adjacent to Colby Street) in the Colebrook, County of Coos, State of New Hampshire, as acquired from Central Railroad by Quitclaim Deed recorded in the Coos County Regis Deeds, Vol. 595, Page 172, dated March, 1977, and as shown on Maine Railroad Company Valuation Sheet V 21/20, dated June, 1916, and as r December 31, 1964, being near Station 2392 + 50, and being a portion No. 2, bounded and described as follows:
