WHEELED OHRV ON-HIGHWAY CONNECTOR PERMIT

Permission to utilize a 0.05-mile section of US-3 in Colebrook as an on-highway connector for Wheeled Off Highway Recreational Vehicles pursuant to the location and specifications as described below is hereby granted. Failure to adhere to all the provisions set forth below and in the NHDOT policy shall render this instrument null and void. The NH Department of Transportation (DOT) and the NH Department of Safety (DOS) reserve the right to revoke the permit at any time. Insufficiencies associated with the proposed use shall be corrected immediately upon notification by a Department representative or the connector shall be closed.

LOCATION: From the intersection Hughes Road, northerly 0.05-miles to a field access point on the west side of US-3.

- OHRVs must use paved shoulders.
- OHRVs shall follow the rules of the road, including traveling in the direction of traffic, traveling in single file, obeying regulatory signage, and not traveling at speeds greater than the posted speed limit.
- OHRVs shall not have studded tires or tracks.
- DNCR shall be responsible for repairing any damage to the highway infrastructure or private property as a result of OHRV use.
- No motor vehicles, trailers or any catering or servicing equipment of any kind shall be parked within the highway right-of-way (ROW).
- No loading or unloading of OHRVs shall occur within the highway ROW.
- The highway ROW varies from 50 feet to 150 feet from the highway centerline on the west side of US-3, and 75 feet from the highway centerline on the east side of US-3.
- OHRV travel is prohibited between 1/2 hour past sunset to 1/2 hour before sunrise.
- OHRV travel is permitted only when trails are officially open.
- DNCR shall be responsible to notify OHRV users of the above listed conditions.

WHEELED OHRV ON-HIGHWAY CONNECTOR PERMIT

Permission to utilize a 0.23-mile section of NH-145 in Colebrook as an on-highway connector for Wheeled Off Highway Recreational Vehicles pursuant to the location and specifications as described below is hereby granted. Failure to adhere to all the provisions set forth below and in the NHDOT policy shall render this instrument null and void. The NH Department of Transportation (DOT) and the NH Department of Safety (DOS) reserve the right to revoke the permit at any time. Insufficiencies associated with the proposed use shall be corrected immediately upon notification by a Department representative or the connector shall be closed.

LOCATION: From the intersection Hughes Road, northerly 0.23-miles to an access point on the east side of NH-145.

- OHRVs must use paved travel lanes, travel on the gravel shoulders is prohibited.
- OHRVs shall follow the rules of the road, including traveling in the direction of traffic, traveling in single file, obeying regulatory signage, and not traveling at speeds greater than the posted speed limit.
- OHRVs shall not have studded tires or tracks.
- DNCR shall be responsible for repairing any damage to the highway infrastructure or private property as a result of OHRV use.
- No motor vehicles, trailers or any catering or servicing equipment of any kind shall be parked within the highway right-of-way (ROW).
- No loading or unloading of OHRVs shall occur within the highway ROW.
- The highway ROW 24.75 feet from the highway centerline.
- OHRV travel is prohibited between ½ hour past sunset to ½ hour before sunrise.
- OHRV travel is permitted only when trails are officially open.
- DNCR shall be responsible to notify OHRV users of the above listed conditions.
