I have always tried to maintain a good neighbor policy, however there is an ongoing problem on Diamond Pond Road in Stewartstown that needs addressing by the Bureau of Trails, the NH DOT, and the town of Stewartstown NH in regards to the posting of numerous signs along Diamond Pond Road in the area of 1401 and 1411. Yes, Lloyd Drew. Attached are photos of signs posted in the past year.

Diamond Pond Road is a public road up to and including the public boat launch. These signs are most probably illegal, they are misleading and they are intimidating. I can sit on my deck at 1401 Diamond Pond Road on any given Saturday and watch as dozens of recreational riders stop, read the signs, and proceed to reverse direction, (mostly turning around in my driveway or parking area.)

This is not only happening with the 4 wheelers, but also kayakers and recreational boaters, again turning around before ever reaching the boat launch.

"Authorized Personnel Only"? Who exactly is the grantor of such authorization?

Chris, can this be addressed before the upcoming boating and OHRV season begins so that countless outdoor enthusiasts aren't continuously turned away from their legal rights to access the public boat launch.

Lloyd needn't know who submitted this complaint, but if it is necessary, so be it. There is no love lost between Mr Drew and I, nor most of the other neighbors. His high handed "rules" don't set well with most. I appreciate any attention paid in resolving this issue.
