Petition for Condemnation

Comes now Public Service Company of New Hampshire, a Corporation organized under the laws of The State of New Hampshire, and having its principal place of business in Manchester, New Hampshire, engaged in the generation, distribution and sale of elsetric energy to the public is Manchester and elsewhere in The State of New Hampshire, and respectfully represents to this Commission as follows:

- (1) In order to meet the reasonable requirements of service to the public, it is necessary for the Company to construct one or more 115 KY transmission lines from Orderton, New Emmpshire to North Moodstock, New Emmpshire.
- (I) The Company is informed and believes and therefore alleges that Simon L. Ruskin and Frances E. Ruskin are the owners, as joint tenants, of certain land in the Town of Easton, County of Grafton, said State, constines now or formerly known as the "Leighton Farm," and being all and the same premises conveyed to said Simon L. Ruskin and Frances E. Ruskin as joint tenants by Mary Heritage Buchmayr by deed dated September 18, 1948, recorded in Grafton County Registry of Deeds, Book 744, Page EET. Reference is made in said deed to earlier deeds recorded in said Registry for a more particular



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description of said premises. Asserting to said deeds referred to mid

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promises are bounded and described as fellows:

FIRST TRICT: A certain tract or parcel of land, with the buildings thereon, situated in Saston and being the larger part of the R D. Slake farm, so called, and described as follows:

Seginning at the southwest corner of D. J. Whitcher's land and mear the highways thence mortherly on the same degree as D. J. Whitcher's west line to land of C. L. Thayer and land of L. A. S. Sowles, thence southerly by land of D. J. Whitcher, D. A. Dree and W. F. ball to a corner; thence mortherly to bound near the highway begun at.

Reserving to C. A. Young a right of way from the highway near bound begun at, mortherly by the east line of said farm to his lands

Being all and the same premises described in deed of C. A. Young to E. S. beighton, dated August 10, 1901, recorded in Grafton County Registry of Ceeds, Book 454, Page 186, Which said deed is incorporately reference in said deed of Mary Heritage Buchmayr to Simon L. Buskin and Frances R. Suskin.

SECOND TRACT: A certain tract of land situated in said baston, it being all of One Mandred (100) acre Lat Number 11 in the Forrth Rame and First Division of Lote in Landaff (now baston) except a small place that the late Stephen Lendall owned.

Teing all and the same presides conveyed by Leonard Dowles and Simma bowles to Movin 5. Let miton by deed dated April 28, 1805, recorded to said sepisity, Nock 470, Page 60, miles said deed is incorporated by reference in said deed of Mary Meritage Suchmays to Simon L. Muskin and Stances 8, Muskin.

(5) The Cospany centres to acquire a right of way two Bundred Trentyfixe (228) feet in width across the precises described in the preceding para raph, and right of way to extend Seventy-five (78) feet westerly and the Numbed firty (180) feet ensterly of a line bounded and described as follows:

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thence running E f1°00' E 3175 feet to an angle point; thence E 5°15' E 588 feet to the northerly boundary fence at land of Cooley, containing 18.5 acres, more or less.

The Company desires to obtain said right ofway in accordance with the form attached hereto and made a part hereof.

(4) The Company further alleges that on October 14, 1947, the said Simon L. Auskin duly executed an eption under the terms of which the Company was granted an irrevocable option for one year to purchase for the sum of One Thousand Dollars (\$1000) a right of way of the same width and across the same premises described above. At the time of execution of the above option the Company neither inex nor believed, nor had information sufficient to form a belief, that said Frances R. Ruskin had any proprietary interest in the above described premises. Upon election by the Company to exercise said option, and upon tender of the agreed purchase price the said Simon L. Ruskin and Frances R. Ruskin refused, and continue to refuse, to execute a deed conveying to the Company said right of way more particularly described above. The Company is unable to agree with said Simon L. Ruskin and Frances R. Ruskin as to the price to be paid for said right of way.

NECRIFORE, Public Service Company of New Empshire prays that the Commission grant it permission to take the right-of-way as above set forth.
