Any and all interest the State of New Hampshire has in a parcel of land adjacent to the Westerly side of the now existing State-owned Concord to Lincoln Railroad Line, being near Station 693 + 00, as shown on Valuation Map 30/14, bounded and described as follows:

Beginning at a point in the Division Line between lands of the State-owned Concord to Lincoln Railroad Line, as now travelled, and land now or formerly of Conkey Construction Company, said point being sixty-nine (69'±) feet, more or less, Westerly of the Center Line of the main track and nearly opposite Station 691 + 30; thence Northerly and parallel with said Center Line of the main track three hundred fifteen (315'±) feet, more or less, to Line of the main track three hundred fifteen (315'±) feet, more or less, to a point in the extension line of the Division Line between lands of the Grantee and land now or formerly of Albert Huot; thence Northwesterly with said extension of the Division Line to a point eight-nine (89') feet Westerly of the Center Line of the main track, said point also being in the existing Railroad Right-of-Way; thence Southerly and Southeasterly with said Railroad Right-of-Way to the point of beginning.
