Any and all interest The State of New Hampshire has in a certain tract of land Westerly of the Spur Line of the Franklin-Tilton Branch of the State-owned Concord to Lincoln Railroad Line in the City of Franklin, County of Merrimack, State of New Hampshire, bounded and described as follows:

All the land lying Easterly of a line twenty-five (25') feet Westerly of and parallel with River Street Center Line, as presently constructed, as shown on a plan Winnipesaukee River Basin Program Interceptor Sewers in Franklin on file in the records of the City of Franklin, said land also being a portion of the property near Station (8 + 75) as shown on Railroad Valuation Sheet V-31/2 on file in the records of the New Hampshire Department of Public Works and Highways; bounded on the North by other land of the Grantee; bounded on the West by land now of the State of New Hampshire and to be deeded to Franklin Falls Hydro Electric Realty Corporation; bounded on the South by land of the City of Franklin; and, bounded on the East by the Westerly Sideline of River Street as now travelled.
