Basis for Intervening:  
Pursuant to Sections 212 and 214 of the Rules of Practice and Procedure of the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission (‘FERC’ or ‘Commission’), 18 C.F.R. §§385.212 and §§385.214, Eversource Energy Service Company (‘Eversource Service’) respectfully moves to intervene in the above-captioned proceeding.

Filing Party:Eversource Service is a service company subsidiary of Eversource Energy, a registered holding company under the Public Utility Holding Company Act of 2005. Eversource Service is affiliated with several public utility subsidiaries that participate in the regional transmission grid coordinated by ISO New England, Inc. (‘ISO-NE’) and conduct business in the ISO-NE administered market. Eversource Service is acting as agent for its electric utility company affiliates, The Connecticut Light and Power Company, Public Service Company of New Hampshire, and NSTAR Electric Company (each doing business as ‘Eversource Energy’) (‘Eversource Energy Companies’).

Grounds for Intervention: Eversource Energy Companies own and operate transmission facilities in the states of Connecticut, Massachusetts and New Hampshire that are available for open access transmission in New England. These transmission facilities are used for regional and local service and are subject to ISO-NE’s operational authority. The Eversource Energy Companies are also responsible for their share of the costs of regional transmission facilities in New England. As transmission owners and customers, the Eversource Energy Companies may be directly affected by the outcome of this proceeding, and those interests cannot be represented adequately by any other party. Accordingly, Eversource Service’s participation in this proceeding on behalf of the Eversource Energy Companies is in the public interest and it respectfully requests that the Commission accept this filing and grant its motion to intervene.
