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Hi Ridge.

Please see the attached correspondence from NHFG where NHFG accepted the final permitting map set and BMPs/protection measures, which included the C189, M108, and H137 structures that are the subject of this amendment. These were also included in our SPN wetland permitting and that correspondence was required for those permits as well. This is the same map set referenced in condition #1 of AoT permit AoT-2205.

The NHB review area included the full width of the P145 ROW, which includes the P145, C189, M108, and H137 lines. The NHB datacheck letters are attached for quick reference.

In summary, the AoT amendment areas on the C189, M108, and H137 lines were not included in the original AoT mapping and fee, just due to the early timing of the submittal, but they were always part of the NHFG/NHB correspondence.

Tom,

This issue could be addressed with a new AoT permit application, or since the additional transmission lines are adjacent to the P145 line it could be addressed with a permit amendment with a waiver of Env-Wq 1503.22(c)(6), which limits the area of "new " disturbance. There is a larger financial impact to the amendment route as RSA 485-A:17 II(b) stipulates an amendment fee of \$500 + \$0.10 per square foot of disturbance.

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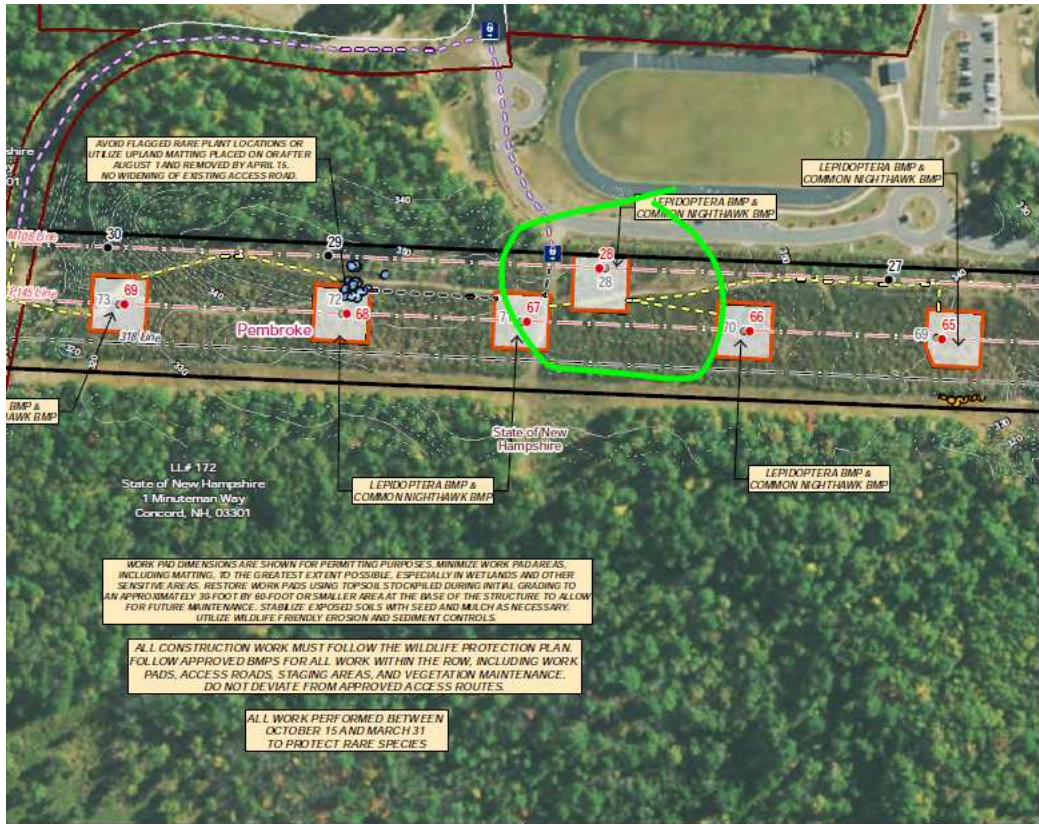
Hi Ridge,

Following up on the voicemail I left you. In addition to the P145 line rebuild, there are several structures on the adjacent C189, M108, and H137 lines that are also in bad shape and need replacing. These structures and associated work pads and access were included on the Permitting Map Set (8/12/22) approved by NHFG but they were not included in the original AoT application. An example location is below, M108 structure 28.

I need to have GIS run the exact calculations but I'd estimate these structures (~18) will require and additional 200K-250k square feet of upland disturbance.

What is the correct way to go about permitting these additional structures? Any guidance you can provide on what would be most efficient for you would be much appreciated. Luckily, these areas have been worked out already with NHFG.

I'm happy to set up a call to discuss more if that helps.

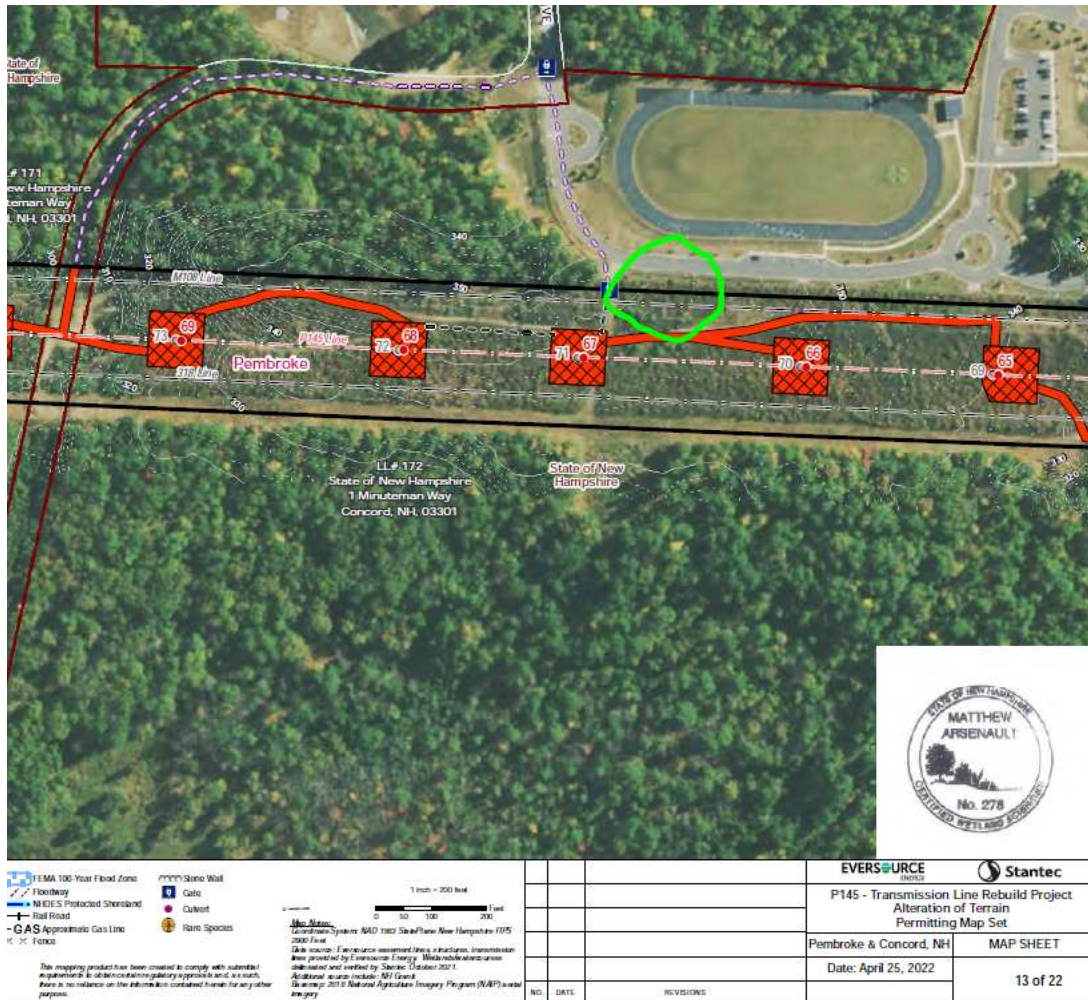

Thanks, that should work for NHFG as long as the staging area south of Garvins Falls Road, that will be established during the active season, is still marked as being held to active season BMPs. According to the plans, it doesn't look like there are areas within the TOY restriction where the BMPs for placing matting in permanently inundated wetlands apply. As these areas require matting placement to be done outside of the dormant season, please let us know if this changes so we can provide further coordination.

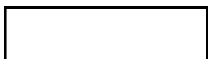

Description: Eversource is proposing to replace 160 wooden structures within the existing P145 transmission line corridor in Concord, Pembroke, and Bow, NH. The wooden poles are deteriorating due to age, cracking, rot, and woodpecker damage and will be replaced with similar steel structures. Existing roads and trails will be utilized to the greatest extent possible, but some new gravel roads and work pads will be created in uplands. Temporary wetland matting will be used to cross wetlands and access wetland structures. Potential vernal pools were identified during November 2021 and will be avoided. Construction is planned for Summer 2022 through Summer 2023.
