

Larry,

The Town of Gorham is beginning a planning study to possibly pursue a reconfiguration of the <u>segment of NH 16 from</u> <u>the northerly intersection of US 2 to Berlin</u>. The existing road provides two lanes each way plus a two-way left turn lane, plus a sidewalk on the west side. The general desire is to eliminate two travel lanes, but there's no clear idea of how best to use the space that this would free up to better accommodate bikes, ped, and possibly OHRVs. Some of the thoughts that have been tossed about are sketched on the typical section below.
