We are forwarding you a copy of an email that we sent to our town officials regarding Northeast Snowmobiles and ATV Rentals' plans to purchase and operate an ATV rental business in Gorham NH at the former Burger King property on Main Street.

We feel that you should be made aware of this site plan review because it effects traffic and safety on state highways.

The 175 OHRVs that the rental company plan on having at this location is outrageous for our small town and will create numerous safety issues. There will be a significant increase in traffic, congestion, noise, enforcement needs and parking problems associated with that volume of patrons parking their personal vehicles.

The majority of OHRV rental customers are mostly out of town or out of state people. They are clueless as to the legal boundaries of operating their rented OHRV's on the highways. All too often, the police department has to respond to calls from townspeople or motorists regarding OHRVs traveling illegally on the Berlin-Gorham Road, on Route 2 heading west up Gorham Hill, on Route 16 south heading towards Conway and also Route 2 east towards Shelburne and Maine. These riders have now entered into 40 to 50+ mph highways, jeopardizing themselves as well as motorists utilizing these roads. This is an extremely concerning safety issue.

No amount of signage or education is or has been a solution to this problem. Riders arrive here from out of town so revved up and excited to ride, there are no rules that apply to them. As one rider said to me, "if you don't like it, why don't you move, I'm here to ride."

Please be aware of these very concerning issues and their potential dangerous outcomes. This number of OHRV's on state highways in our small town is a hazardous situation and an impact analysis is certainly warranted prior to this business venture being approved.
