It has come to my attention that there is a regulation (see below) which requires that some OHRV trail connectors be closed until an "investigation is completed." It's not clear what "notification" is required but I am supposing that my bringing it to your attention may suffice. Since the closing of Page Hill Road there is no logical or functional reason for NH Route 3 here in Lancaster to be accessible to OHRV. As far as I know there it no longer serves the purpose of connecting any trail systems and stands alone as an oasis of sorts. If the district engineer or bureau administrator is notified that use of the trail connector constitutes a danger to the public health, safety or welfare, or the trail no longer serves its original purpose of connecting major trail systems or services to the trail system, the permit shall be suspended and the trail connector shall be closed until an investigation is completed. The Department shall investigate the allegations and determine if the permit should be revoked and the trail connector closed permanently.

On another matter, you might've noticed that I have not yet submitted my request to plant trees west of the rotary (after plaguing you all those months) but I still intend to do so, still have the blueprint. Should I submit that to you?
